ENGLISH COURSES









General English

Intensive English – Elementary to Early Intermediate

You will be studying intensive English full time. This includes communicative activities to improve fluency and accuracy in grammar through speaking, listening, reading, writing, and vocabulary development.

English and Electives – Early Intermediate to Advanced

You will be studying intensive English in the mornings. In the afternoons, depending on your English level, you can choose a wide range of elective subjects such as:

Electives

- Speaking & Listening
- Computing
- Business English
- Ecotourism
- Hospitality
- New Zealand Studies
- Reading, Writing & Vocabulary

Students at intermediate level can also choose from the following:

English Plus Certificate

- Hospitality (Terms 2 & 4) In this 72-hour elective students have an introduction to the New Zealand hospitality industry. Topics include restaurant skills, bar service, reception skills and coffee making. This elective is ideal for working holiday students as it provides work skills and experience. The hours are often irregular and a uniform is required.
- Hospitality Plus Kiwi Baking (Terms 1 & 3) This 72-hour elective includes an introduction to Hospitality including a one week internship plus Kiwi baking. Kiwi baking may also be studied as a standalone four week course at the end of each of these modules.
- Business & Computing (Terms 2 & 4) This 72-hour elective introduces basic business concepts and language. The computing sessions within the course are adjusted to suit the abilities of the students. After this course, students may take the TOEIC test, enrol for the Cambridge BEC course starting in August or go on to further study in a mainstream business course (subject to entry requirements).

- Introduction to Tertiary Study (Terms 1 & 3) This 72-hour elective (for intermediate students) aims to introduce students to the skills needed for tertiary study. The course focuses on academic essay writing, academic reading, notetaking and oral presentation skills.
- Applied Language Studies (Terms 2 & 4) This 72-hour elective (for upper intermediate students) aims to build on those skills learned in Introduction to Tertiary Study. High-level students who demonstrate motivation and a capacity for hard work may be allowed to take the course without having done Introduction to Tertiary Study. A student passing this course would be well prepared for Foundation or mainstream study (subject to entry requirements).
- Volunteer Work (Terms 1-4) In this 72-hour elective students are placed in the Christchurch community as volunteers: caring for the elderly, helping in schools, office work, retail and gardening. Although hours can be irregular student enjoy practising their English and making friends in a work environment.
- IELTS Preparation Intensive exam preparation to cover the components of reading, writing, speaking and listening.

English Plus Courses will not run in January 2008.

Exam Preparation

All applicants must sit a pre-entry test.

IELTS Preparation – Lower Intermediate (See English Plus).

Cambridge Exam Courses

We specialise in preparing our students for Cambridge examinations. These exams are internationally recognised and offered at different levels. Many students take these exams for job entry, university entry, or as recognition of their English level.

Cambridge exams have five components: reading comprehension, writing genres, use of English, listening comprehension, and an interview. Many students take these exams for job entry, university entry, or as recognition of their English level. Cambridge Preliminary English Test (PET) – Post-Elementary

Cambridge First Certificate in English (FCE) – Intermediate

Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE) – Upper Intermediate

Cambridge Business English Certificate (BEC)

English Teacher Training Teacher Training Certificate – Upper Intermediate

This 5-week full time course is for intermediate students. It focuses on the principles of Communicative Language Teaching and involves practical teaching sessions. After the course, students may take the Cambridge Teaching Knowledge Test (TKT) at extra cost. High level students may be able to continue on to do the CELTA.

Group Programmes

We offer tailor-made programmes for groups ranging from three weeks to six months. CPIT works closely with each institution group to meet their requirements and student needs.

Enrolment


Students can enrol for a minimum of **4** weeks for blocks of 4 to 50 weeks per year.

For exam preparation and English Plus Certificate courses, students are required to enrol for the length of the whole course.

Holiday Entitlement

After 24 weeks of study you will be eligible for one week's holiday every 12 weeks. To apply for a holiday, you must fill in a Student Leave Application Form which will then be authorised and signed by your Programme Leader. If possible please indicate your holiday days when enrolling.
